In a time when all we hear about is elections, war, trauma, hard luck stories and greed, Sunday mornings are an oasis in the desert. Why is it that the media focuses on the negative, when we could be hearing from people like Peter guiding ships into Gladstone, Dick Smith's adventures, the Fergie tractor trip, Ted the farmer from the West and Gilbert, remarkable and funny at 106. What a rich

tapestry of guests you have from all walks of life, all corners of the country. True inspirations all – it lifts the spirit, revitalises the soul and ignites my passion to explore this magnificent country of ours! WHY I LIVE WHERE I LIVE

I live where I live because it reminds me of what life is all about - away from the urgency of the city, the traffic snarls and road rage - where you can still leave your keys in the car and the house unlocked. The locals have time to talk and show genuine concern for each other, without invading your privacy. There is a true sense of community - a community that mobilised to stop the destruction of our local native forest. community which twice in recent times threw benefit someone's uninsured house that burnt down, providing clothing, furniture, funds and promises of assistance with rebuilding. True community!

And my modest patch? I look out onto the towering gums in the forest, kookaburras on the fence posts, over 100 species of birds in the garden, flocks of cockatoos and galahs overhead. There's a paddock full of kangaroos opposite, koalas and possums grunting at night, the occasional visit from an echidna or wombat.

The air here is so fresh, mornings so crisp, nights cool and starry, and snow at times to delight. Seasons are distinct — winter refreshingly cold, spring full of brilliant bulbs and blossoms, summers mild and dry, and autumn trees spectacular. To me, this is heaven on earth — and only one hour from Melbourne."
