TRENTHAM BRIGADE LENDS A HAND TO NSW

One of Trentham's fire trucks, with a crew of four local fire fighters, has travelled to NSW to help control the Blue Mountains bushfires.

The team will add its weight to other tankers from interstate responding to the call for assistance from NSW fire authorities.

Leaving behind a lush green district still in the damp emergence of spring, the Trentham volunteers are expecting to be thrust into the scorching heat of NSW's early summer which has dried its mountain forests into a massive fuel source

As this report is being written, the team does not know where they will be deployed or when they will be able to return. We know that it will be an anxious wait for their families and we thank them for their willingness to release their loved ones to serve in a potentially dangerous situation far from home.

As our own fire season is now drawing closer, the CFA is urging residents and land holders to begin to identify potential fire fuel sources around their properties and take steps to remove them while the opportunity remains.

Council Watch

If George Orwell was living in Hepburn Shire I'm sure he'd write, 'all towns are equal but some towns are more equal than others'.

Council has repeatedly told Trentham that it can't provide information on a town or Ward basis. So it was fascinating to see the call for applications for funding to support events in Creswick Ward – amounts of \$5,000, \$2,000 and \$500 and a total of \$18,000 up for grabs. This compares very favourably with the \$5,000 in Council support to Spudfest, which had sought \$10,000 consistent with Booktown and the Swiss-Italian Festa, but argued down by a Councillor who thought '\$5,000 is enough for Trentham'. So, \$18,000 for Creswick which is, on Council figures, only slightly more than double Trentham's population but apparently deserving of 3.6 times more funding for events!

Interesting also to note the advice from a Council officer that Trentham was not eligible for funding from the \$15,000 allocation for fertilizing sportsgrounds, apparently because it is on DSE land (perpetuating the supposed 'policy' that Council will only spend money on assets it owns or controls).

Georgie Patterson challenged this in a question to Council's October meeting, in Creswick, at which the Mayor denied any such policy – and so we believe that the Trentham oval will now receive funding. While that's one good outcome (and Georgie says we are only asking for ~ 5% of the total funds), maybe it's an indication of future fair treatment?

Locals take their Tai Chi to China

A group of local Tai Chi enthusiasts has just returned from China after taking second place in an international competition.

The Lilac Moon Tai Chi group, headed by instructor Patricia Kent is based in Trentham. The contingent of eight spent a week in the seaside town of Bei Dai Ha training for the competition.

Every two years an international conference is hosted at a local university and is attended by hundreds of people from across China as well as groups from Germany, Korea and Japan.

The Australian team performed a traditional Yang 24 form in front of a packed auditorium and were the second group to compete. They learned that they had been awarded second place with a silver medal while in transit at Beijing airport on their return trip home.

Group leader Patricia Kent, who teaches Tai Chi classes at three different locations in Trentham, says it was a great honour to be asked to perform at the international event. Whilst she doesn't usually see the martial art as being competitive it came as a great surprise to find out that the group received a silver medal.

Tai Chi is often referred to as a soft form of martial art but it still requires discipline and regular training. Mrs Kent also teaches classes in Ballan, Kyneton and Meredith and can often be seen practising most mornings at the Trentham lake.

The beauty of Tai Chi is that it is accessible to everyone at all ages, it is recognised by medical practitioners as a passive exercise that has many health benefits including stimulating the body and mind.

Patricia Kent has been training in Tai Chi for nearly 30 years and teaching for around 23 years.



There has been an increase in reports of people receiving phone calls purported from reputable companies advising that their computers have a virus and requesting remote access to run a scan.

If you receive a phone call out of the blue about your computer and remote access is requested, it is recommended that you hang up, independently obtain the phone number of the company (eg White Pages search) and call the company to verify the information provided by the caller.

If you have given remote access to your computer or believe your computer may be compromised it is important that you seek advice from a qualified computer technician.



One critic described the film as "showing up the hollow existence of living in the American suburbs".

On November 13, members are sure to be amused by The Court Jester (1956) with Danny Kaye in the role of a hapless carnival performer who gets involved in more trickery than he bargains for, once he falls in love with Captain Jean played by Glynis Johns. FORUM Report

If death and taxes are the only certainties, change is probably the only constant.

We live in a rapidly changing world and the Trentham Community FORUM is a strong voice for the aspirations and concerns of our community. The FORUM meets regularly with our Ward Councillor and Council CEO Aaron van Egmond. It also seeks to coordinate and support the major initiatives happening within our community as part of its goal to promote 'the overall betterment of Trentham and districts'.

One of the most pressing issues on our agenda is a review of the Town Plan.

The recent 'Plan Melbourne' for managing population growth (an additional 2.5 million by 2050) proposes, among other measures, that rural towns in a wide arc around Melbourne with good transport links should absorb a lot of this growth. Trentham's recent rapid growth has been strongly influenced by our proximity to the Calder rail and freeway corridor and we can expect more 'knock-on' population pressure as a result of Melbourne's growth.

Retaining town character and our sense of community requires us to be ready to deal with 'crunch' questions around expanding the town boundary and more infill development ... planning is a very bureaucratic game!

The FORUM tries to keep abreast of the planning process and is keen to build on the collaborative work we did with La Trobe University last year so that the views of our community are heard loud and clear. We need your involvement, so if you're interested please contact me or Ian MacBean, 54241727.

Of course, the strength of Trentham's voice in town planning and general representation and advocacy is dependent on community participation. Membership of the FORUM is open to all citizens (\$10 per annum), businesses (\$35) and community groups (\$35).

The wider and stronger our membership the better we can represent Trentham and districts communities.

"Council also provided a commitment to provide appropriate notice for future works in Trentham."

"Initial discussions have already occurred with (Rahill's Rd) residents regarding replacement plantings and Council is committed to further discussions with residents ..." which is welcome but we really need planting guidelines for the whole town. This issue has been referred to the Ward Councillor and the Trentham Community FORUM.

More than just courses...

Trentham Neighbourhood Centre is an incorporated notfor-profit that offers the local community the opportunity to participate in hobby, recreational and health courses and to be involved in the community in different ways. We run or auspice programs like the youth group and the Portrait of Community as part of Spudfest, but we are also involved with a number of activities across Hepburn Shire. One of these activities is the No Interest Loans Scheme or NILS.

This scheme offers people on a low income the chance to buy goods with a loan and repay that loan with no interest; a much better option than hire purchase. Not only does the scheme assist people on low incomes to buy things they may need like washing machines, fridges, heaters and home repairs, but it gives local people an opening to volunteer. NILS is underwritten by the NAB and organized through Good Shepherd and in Hepburn has a Coordinator who manages the scheme but it also relies on volunteers to make contact with people who request loans and interview them. As with many volunteer positions there is some turnover in people willing to offer their services, and NILS is currently looking for people who can give some of their time to assist with this very worthwhile project. SELLING A HOUSE? You may be able to apply the main residence exemption!

The main residence exemption allows you together with your spouse to class one property as your main residence that may be exempt or partially exempt from Capital Gains Tax on sale.

If you have lived in the house for the entire time of ownership and have not classed another house as your main residence during that time, generally you would be eligible for full exemption.

Eligibility for full or at least partial exemption will depend on a number of factors:

- If you use the dwelling for income producing purposes, you may be able to continue to apply the main residence exemption for up to six years after you move out.
- You can be absent from the residence indefinitely and still claim an exemption providing that you have not used the residence for income producing purposes and not claimed main residence on another dwelling during that time.
- If dwelling is transferred via an estate, the main residence exemption can still apply as long as the dwelling is sold within two years.
- Up to two hectares of adjoining land to your main residence may also be eligible

A market valuation at the date the property is first rented is required if partial main residence exemption is to be applied.

Even a black and white image of a yoga posture suggests some of the effort and movement that gave rise to it and is now contained in a dynamic stillness. One way of describing a 'yoga of current affairs' is to suggest that it directs this movement, that formed the posture, outward: to face the challenges of our world. On the one hand we practice the movements that give rise to a yoga posture, on the other hand we use the energies and faculties involved, to deepen and widen our perceptions and insights in the situation and to hasten the pace at which we develop those perceptive, emotional and intellectual resources to match the speed at which the world around us runs out of hand ...

"We perceive the degradation of our environment only if and when the pace of that degradation is faster than the speed at which our senses deteriorate."

What the German environmental philosopher and activist Klaus-Michael Meier-Abbich ca 20 years ago said about the senses, can also be said about the degradation of our thinking capacity to form adequate concepts to make sense of what is going on etc. The speed at which the proliferation of gadgets removes us more and more from direct perceptions and experiences is matched by the speed at which slogans, clichés, weasel-words and language traps distract us from the urgent task of developing and activating our thinking to a level of penetration and clarity needed to unravel the web of confusion which keeps us entangled. We all have good intentions, of course, but the discipline to develop our inner resources that enable us to act on them, is another matter. Yoga means discipline. A yoga of current affairs can be seen as a young development of Eastern and Western traditions.

Trentham Votes

Voting at the Trentham polling place at the September Federal Election produced some interesting results:

Labor 38.0% Liberal 32.3% Greens 17.8% (*Informal* 6.4%) Sex 2.9% Palmer 2.7% Others 3.3% (total for the other 5 parties)

The 30% of voters who directed their first preference away from the major parties reflected the disaffection seen widely throughout the Australian electorate.

These figures also send a message to the major parties that they must try harder to win the Trentham vote.

Next year's State election will be fought on new boundaries, if the electoral boundaries review recommendations are confirmed, which will see Trentham (and Daylesford) in the Macedon electorate.

This will be a real opportunity for Trentham to put forward 2-3 priority projects for political support – what do you think?


