It's back! Welcome to the latest edition of our local community Newsletter. There are many groups active in Trentham, and this is a good way to communicate with the residents of Trentham and surrounding areas.

TRATA belongs to everyone in Trentham and it's your way to have a say in the future of the town.

On 12<sup>th</sup> February 3 members of the Trentham community attended an excellent presentation in Creswick titled "Innovation in Rural Communities" given by Dr. Ian Plowman, and organizational psychologist. He has researched the question "why are some rural towns more innovative than others?" and his presentation gave the results of his research. Briefly, almost none of Australia's rural towns existed 200 years ago. Each community came about because of some economic or social reason. People moved to these new communities because they offered better prospects. In most cases, the economic or social reason that led to the establishment of a community no longer exists. Unless a town can reinvent itself, to be attractive in the face of today's competing opportunities, it will die. He found the most striking difference between the most innovative town, and the other participating towns is the extent to which there is broad-based investment and proactive participation in community life. "People make the place." He also handed out a paper "Meetings without discussion, how to hear and say more while talking less". There was certainly a lot of food for thought in what he presented. #### TRENTHAM IN JANUARY

Rainfall 22.8mm Av 54.5 Mean max temp. 23.4°C Av 21.9 Dry, hot first half, 1<sup>st</sup> was the fourth successive day over 30°. Heat continued until 12<sup>th</sup> then cooler spells predominated. SSE winds were frequently strong, reaching storm force early on 17<sup>th</sup> when several large trees were felled over the region. Rainfall was 42% of average and mean monthly temp. was 1.2° above. A noteworthy lack of thunder.

#### **Global Warming Forum**

Fifty-four local people attended a Forum in the Mechanics Institute to hear the latest information on global warming. The forum, sponsored by TRATA on the 5<sup>th</sup> of February, was presented by Cr David Jones, Mayor of Bendigo and an accredited Al Gore Ambassador, proved challenging with some lively discussion about what the impact of climate change might be on Trentham and district.

As a follow-up to the Forum approximately 20 people have indicated their interest and willingness to be involved in setting-up a **Trentham Sustainability Group**. Another group, with some

overlapping membership, will work on the development of a **Community Plan** for Trentham and District.

Climate change is one of those big, almost-incomprehensible issues that have the capacity to overwhelm and paralyse us. One of the best responses to challenges of this magnitude is 'to build community' so these initiatives offer our community the opportunity to get involved and do something about shaping Trentham the way we would like it to be in future.
