
What a wonderful time of year to share with friends and family in our gorgeous town.

Arts converge at ADFAS event

In a confluence of the arts, 75 ADFAS Central Victoria members and guests were treated to a pre-opening exhibition of Pacific Island and Australian Aboriginal artworks at the Cope-Williams Winery and Gallery in Romsey, followed by a talk that embraced the 'weird and whacky world of South Arabian architecture'.

The talk, by UK Middle East expert, Chris Bradley, followed the path of the scent traders through Yemen from Sana'a to the Red Sea, past the UNESCO heritage site of Shibam, with its precarious mud-brick buildings and on to the ancient site of the Temple of the Moon God, used during the reign of the Queen of Sheba, where fabulous discoveries are being made. Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque in neighbouring Muscat is a demonstration of fading oil wealth today, but Chris' talk highlighted earlier treasures of fine arts and architecture, which today's war in Yemen prevents us exploring.

April - Thursday 6, Sylvia Sagona, Madame de Pompadour and the Politics of Porcelain

Sylvia Sagona, our very popular first ADFAS CV lecturer, will return to Kyneton Town Hall to delight us again with another French-themed talk. Sylvia is an internationally recognised specialist on 19th century French art, literature and society. She leads cultural tours to France, Italy and Spain and lectures to learned societies, galleries and museums. Sylvia will speak on the "Divine Marquise" who rose from obscurity to become Louis XV's mistress, sole confidant and power behind the throne. She cleverly maintained her power over the King in her role as arbiter of taste. She masterminded the porcelain Manufacture de Sevres and oversaw its designs that subtly celebrated her intelligence and beauty throughout Europe.

Founding members are especially welcome at this lecture, which celebrates ten years of ADFAS CV.

All are welcome to join the full walk, or part of it.



DAYLESFORD MACEDON RANGES OPEN STUDIOS DMROS 2017

Sat 29 April - Sun 30 April

Thirty artists selected by an independent Curatorial Panel of expert directors from the NGV, Heide and Alcaston galleries are opening up their studios over three weekends for the fifth Daylesford Macedon Ranges Open Studios (DMROS) program, which takes place this year for the first time in the Autumn.

Drawing over 4,000 visitors each year, the free program offers the public the opportunity to go 'behind the scenes' of the creative process, meet the artists in their creative spaces and to learn about their work and inspiration.

Participating artists include sculptor and print maker Tim Jones; fine art photographer Deborah Mullins, who is also opening her Heskett garden; former fine arts lecturers/painters Anne Saunders & Doug Wright; aerial landscape artist Greg Mallyon; handcraft photographer Ellie Young; and Victorian inspired jeweler/Asian-influenced painter, Liz Archer.

DMROS 2017 includes 11 artists new to the program such as renowned sculptor/ceramicist Petrus Spronk and fellow members Clay Space; scientist/wildlife artist William Ritchie; functional contemporary ceramicist, Emma Jimson; and charcoal/pastel drawer/painter, Brian Reberger.

This year also for the first time, 12 artists will participate in Art-full Conversations in their studios, hosted by Creative Producer Jill Rivers at the beginning and end of the open days.

As the second weekend of DMROS coincides with Spudfest, the Talks on Saturday 6 May will take place with Trentham artists: painter Louise Otten and Printmaker Diane Longley.

The hub of the trail and site of the accompanying DMROS group exhibition will be held this year at The Convent Gallery, Daylesford.



TRAVEL & YOUR HEALTH

While most travel-related illnesses are minor, all travellers should be aware of relevant health issues before they go. Update your vaccinations and ask about other recommended immunisations. Organise travel insurance, including cover should you need to be evacuated to a suitable hospital.

People who travel overseas have up to a 50% chance of contracting a travel-related illness. Some very serious infectious diseases are endemic in some parts of the world. All travellers should be prepared and aware of health issues and take measures to protect themselves.

You may want to arrange vaccinations or medications to protect against diseases such as hepatitis, typhoid or malaria. In fact, some countries legally require travellers to have certain vaccinations, such as yellow fever. As you will need to have some vaccinations weeks or months before travel, it is best to see your doctor six to eight weeks before you go. If you must travel at short notice however, you can still have some vaccines.

Your doctor will be able to advise which vaccines are suitable for you depending on:

- **Your medical history and age,**
- **Destination and likely accommodation**
- **The season in which you travel**
- **Length of stay**
- **Type of travel, for example, bus tour or backpacking**

Springs Medical Centre is a member of the Travel Medicine Alliance and we encourage everyone travelling overseas to seek travel health advice prior to travel by making an appointment with the dedicated Travel Clinic at Springs Medical in Daylesford or with their GP in Trentham.

Does the \$1.6 million super pension cap affect you?

From 1 July 2017 members with superannuation in pension phase are subject to a \$1.6 million transfer balance cap. This means that:

- The maximum amount a member can have in pension phase is \$1.6 million (across all super accounts).
- Amounts above \$1.6 million need to be withdrawn from the fund or commuted back to accumulation phase.
- If funds greater than \$1.6 million are left in pension phase, additional tax will be levied on the excess amount.
- Earnings on amounts in pension phase remain tax free, whilst those in accumulation phase are taxed at 15%.

Example:

John has \$1.8 million in pension phase in super split between two funds, \$1.4 million in fund A and \$400,000 in fund B. To comply with the changes, John applies to fund B to commute \$200,000 back to accumulation phase before 1 July 2017.

This ensures that John's remaining pension balance across both funds of \$1.6 million is tax free and that no excess transfer tax is levied.

Please note special rules apply to defined benefit pensions.




