MITCH was formed 12 months ago by Trentham local Bern Barry and a diverse cross section of local residents based in the Trentham, Daylesford, Woodend, Macedon and Kyneton region.

MITCH - Music in the Central Highlands - offers entertainment in the form of music concerts held at private residences and noted public locations. Its seasonal concert series is aimed at promoting the talents of local musicians and performers. MITCH is also a forum for established local music groups to perform and promote themselves. Incorporated as a not-for-profit, all concert proceeds provide ongoing funding and support bringing music to local residents. It is anticipated in the future that MITCH will

offer scholarship opportunities and specific musical tuition to worthy recipients.

MITCH's 2012 highlight included the successful running of four concerts with diverse programming selected by Henry Vyhnal. Local identity Tom Walsh, was appointed as inaugural Patron and MITCH issued its first gift certificates to young musical performers at its Summer concert, held under the elms of a local Trentham resident.

MITCH's Autumn concert will be at the Kyneton Anglican Church on Sunday 21st April 2013 with performances from Katie Nowland and Daylesford Soul Choir.

Domino Trail Extension Trentham to Lyonville Rail Trail

The rail corridor between Falls Road in Trentham and Lyonville has now been cleared and groomed thanks to the efforts of the Department of Infrastructure at Hepburn Shire Council. Thirty-five years of growth and neglect have been cleared away to reveal a magnificent walking/cycling trail.

Senior Project Engineer for the Shire, Darren Dumesny, and his team from Butler Excavations and Driscoll Engineering Services have spent the past two weeks clearing and grading the trail, so that walkers and cyclists can now enjoy an all weather excursion through the beautiful Wombat State Forest.



The work on the trail was made possible through a grant from the Hepburn Shire Council. There is still some work to be completed including protective barriers across roadways and bridges to prevent access for 4WD's and new directional signage.

"This is one of the most satisfying projects I have worked on" commented Darren Dumesny as he inspected the completed works with Andy Robertson.

Special thanks should also go to Cr Sebastian Klein and former Cr Jon Barrell for their effective lobbying and support for this project over the past few years.

Although the DSE had to withdraw their financial support for the project, they have agreed to provide "in kind" support with a diversion track and river crossing around the Historic Coliban River Trestle Bridge. So, by early May, we anticipate that the trail will be complete.

So now you can choose to walk either the original Domino Trail out to Domino Creek and back or take the new Domino Trail extension to Lyonville and enjoy a rewarding drink at the end at the Radio Springs Hotel.

Have You Visited The Wombat Forest?

Friday 27 January 2013 saw the launch of the Wombat Forest Children's Space in the Trentham Library at 15 Albert Street. The Lions Club of Trentham Inc. and the Hepburn Shire funded the project.

After the official opening, the children nestled in under the forest canopy and amongst the Wombats and Toadstools. They listened intently to several stories read by Pam Chitttendon and were then enthralled by a rendition of the story The Giant Turnip passionately narrated by Frances Palmer.



Local artists Emma Pryse and Robyn Stickland created the design, inspired by the Wombat Forest. Emma is a puppet maker and has twenty years experience creating installations and props for theatre and festivals whilst Robyn is a primary school teacher and craft workshop facilitator.

The materials used to create the space were hand dyed and dry felted wool, as well as reused 100% wool blankets. The Kapok stuffing fibre is soft silky floss that grows from the pods of the Kapok tree – it is a sustainable crop and a hypoallergenic material.

Have you taken your pre-schooler to Story time each Friday from 9:45am to 10:30am? There are stories, songs and a craft activity and it's a great way for parents to introduce their children to language and reading in a fun way.

The Wombat Forest is a wonderful space in the library for all children to curl up and enjoy a good book. Designed and created by locals it is to be enjoyed by all.

It is amazing how sometimes after what seems like aeons (but was actually years) of struggle can give way suddenly to a period of activity.

It has been brilliant to see the Domino Trail finally emerging into a rail trail that joins the existing loops as well as connecting Trentham to Lyonville. Also to finally see the kids dream of a BMX track come to fruition and the Trentham Avenues of Honour officially recognised by council.

This progress reflects years of work and collaboration from all manner of people in the community and I have to recognise the efforts of the Trentham FORUM, the Neighbourhood Centre, the Friends of Stoney Creek, the Historical Society, the Friends of the Station and a special mention must go to the Robertsons who have had a significant hand in all of these projects.

These achievements really are a testament to working together and in this regard I encourage everyone to take part in the Trentham Facilities Review (thanks to those who already are contributing). We have building condition reports on four Trentham Facilities and are developing a strategy to maintain and, if necessary, expand these for the use of Trentham community into the future.

Many thanks to all those who helped make the OurSay Council Plan process so successful. To a great extent this experiment in democracy paid off for council and Trentham, with over 200 questions, 2,500 votes and over 550 comments it is one of the most successful engagement processes undertaken by Hepburn yet and one that supports our bid to have our facilities treated fairly and our future considered as seriously as other parts of the shire.

Everything's De-Lovely For M.R. Film Society

At the March meeting of the Macedon Ranges Film Society, members were treated to a film about one of the most gifted people to grace the musical field in the twentieth century. The American songwriter, Cole Porter, is the subject of the film "De-Lovely" which commences with the elderly Porter looking back over his wildly creative working life and his unusual personal life. Kevin Kline plays the part of Porter with a convincing blend of bonhomie and complexity. The lovely Ashley Judd plays Porter's wife, Linda, who tolerates her husband's unconventional approach to their marriage. The film is peppered with twenty-eight of the most memorable songs of the time, all written by this talented man.

The film for April is of quite a different genre. The Lemon Tree is a 2008 Israeli drama about a Palestinian widow who must defend her lemon tree field when a new Israeli Defense Minister moves next door to her and threatens to have the trees destroyed.

In the midst of the angst set up between these two characters, the widow develops a bond with the Minister's wife. This further complicates the matter, especially when the dispute over removal of the lemon trees or otherwise gets as far as the Supreme Court. This film will be shown on April 10th.

Peace MeditationAn 'activist' approach


When counting Trentham's assets, I notice that our Neighbourhood House is flanked to one side by the Masonic Lodge and to the other by St George Anglican Church. With the Uniting Church and the Catholic Church in walking distance, one might wonder why meditate for peace in the Neighbourhood Centre, when it is surrounded by 4 spiritual centres that are one way or another well equipped and designed for that very purpose.

An obvious answer would be that not everyone who might feel at home in the Neighbourhood House would feel at home in those other centres. There is also the matter of emphasis: in churches the emphasis is on prayer, ritual and teaching, in masonic lodges the emphasis is on ritual and ethics. Meditation comes into it, because without it one would not know and experience the meaning of either ritual or prayer ...

One prays to give praise or thanks and to make requests. If one – with St Francis – asks the Lord: "Make me into an instrument of peace", then – in meditation - we might actually consider ourselves as such an instrument, our body, life and soul: God-given, nature-given or 'just' a product of evolution.

In our peace meditation we temper, tune and train this instrument that enables us to think, to feel, sense and act with a focus on peace. We concentrate on the idea of "Free Peace", peace achieved not by imposition and/or war, but in freedom. In the process we discover and engage lesser known inner resources, well known in Eastern as well as Western spiritual schools.

Hence our weekly practice on the Monday morning, involving movement, methodical guidance, generous time for one's own meditation in silence, conversation and a minimum of ritual that however makes a lot of sense. Henk Bak

Remember our market is always held on the 4th Sunday of the month, with additional ones held if there are five Sundays in the month.
