

Mid-winter and there's lots of news, but first: what are the advantages of small communities? Well there are lots – but the one that seems important at the moment is that small communities can 'get their act together' in ways that are more difficult for bigger centres. Elsewhere in the Newsletter is an item on a meeting between several community groups interested to explore how they can strengthen their collective contribution to Trentham's future.

The big news is a proposal for a Multi Function Indoor Facility to provide a fire assembly point and various other community services. It's a very big project which already has some strong backing but it will need the whole community to get behind it – so, to borrow from Barack Obama, we hope the community will say 'Yes we can!' when presented with a more detailed concept.

"Words-in-Winter" is looking good so try to support the local group who has worked hard to put the program together. And best wishes to the new Saturday market, starting the same weekend, which should be a boost to our town – along with the 4th Sunday Market and the 1st Saturday Mini Market, we're doing well.

TRATA thanks Council and Cr Klein for the budget amendment of 'up to \$20,000 to paint the Station'. Also, a couple of well-attended community consultations re the Bath St Reserve should bring progress on the management of that and the other natural reserves around town.

Gael Elliott and I recently met with the new owners of the Cosmo (busy cleaning up the garden) and heard something of their plans for what one of the Community Plan respondents described as 'the heart of our town'. We're sure Trentham will be delighted with what is proposed and we'll all have the opportunity to learn more through a community meeting the owners intend to hold. We'll leave it for them to tell their own story and, in the meantime, ask the community to be patient with what will be a complex planning and building program. *Ian MacBean*

This has the advantage of avoiding a clash of events, but as side-effect the impression of excessive costs: where all other events in WiW are charging gold coins, the music evening costs \$25.- for adults, \$15. – for children and \$40.- for a family. The simple explanation is, that our music nights are a fundraiser, as part of the Trentham Community Group's commitment to community ownership of the Neighbourhood Centre and its development as a community hub. Anyhow, nothing of what 'Words in Winter' offers is for sale: you can't buy talent, inspiration, dedication, beauty, humour, experience...all what the programme offers is priceless. And in that sense, the low costs for the other events can also be seen as a saving: to allow you to pay for the one fundraiser in the programme and to enjoy an unique night, with a variety of local musicians, of romantic, classical, light classical and popular music, and some poetry as well.

Rainfall 91.5mm Av 121.6 Mean max temp. 8.8°C Av 8.3 DAMP & FOGGY.

Total rain was 75% of average and the mean max. temp. was 0.5° above average. There was fog on 16 days and air frosts on 8. The lowest min. was - 2.6° on 18th. A wetter spell gave 95.5mm over the days ended 11th, but rain was insufficient to enter the water table which remained dry to the end. Cold spell 9-13th saw hail and light snow showers. 30th was an unusual day of Summer-style thunderstorms with hail and strong winds. Jan-June rain was just 54% of average.

Veggie soup and bread will be provided by Red Beard Bakery whilst we talk about the needs of people with a disability and how the community can modify their buildings and information to enable access to people of all abilities, including provision of access for scooters, prams, wheelchairs, walkers, people with sight and hearing loss and people with an intellectual disability. We will also be showing a highly entertaining 10 minute DVD that highlights obstacles for a person with a disability in their daily lives. Another highlight of the forum will be the introduction of a newly appointed Disability Advocate Karen McAloon, she will be available to talk one on one about any issues individuals with a disability may need assistance with.

Do Your Bit and Get Fit

Need to get around town and want to get fit? Why not get on a bike. Trentham is the perfect place for cycling. You can do your bit to reduce greenhouse gases by using a bike for those short trips around town and get fit at the same time. COMMUNITY GROUPS MEET

Representatives of the Mechanics Institute Hall Committee, Neighbourhood Centre and TRATA met at the Station, 22 June to explore how they could work together to increase awareness of their respective activities, coordinate these and *support* each other in their collective endeavours to strengthen the Trentham community. Several of those present are involved in other community groups which gave the meeting even wider coverage. It was stressed that the meeting was exploratory and fully respected the separate roles of the participating groups.

It was noted that the meeting was, in part, a response to many calls in the community plan surveys asking community groups to work together more. Some of the issues discussed included the need for 'a town committee' able to represent the interests of the whole community; attracting financial support and the importance of seed and matching funding; buildings maintenance; volunteers; need for a community centre; 'ownership' of the community plan; and need for a community bank.

It was agreed that there should be a further meeting (to be hosted in rotation) and that other groups are very welcome to become involved. TOURISM PROJECT

I attended the community discussion on 31 March 2009. Jeff Brown, the moderator of the excellent discussion invited the chairs of the various discussion groups to formalise their thinking. I chaired the group called *Tourism Product: Positioning* The core theme of the group was the creation of greater town unity. The need for this has been a constant refrain since my family started living here about 10 years ago.

There was general agreement that

one of the ways this could be best achieved is by holding an allembracing town event with a "**Trentham Signature**" (themes special to Trentham are highlighted below). Readers will know that similar festivals are held in Blackwood, Creswick, Clunes etc.In

Blackwood, Creswick, Clunes etc.In summary, the group strongly thought that the **Fun Run** held in on the third Sunday of November could be combined with:

- Games of chance and skill at sportsground;
- old fashioned sports events at sportsground (see Trentham sports day dvd 1964);
- a "biggest vegetable" competition of some sort
- something "Horsey", being a horse show of some sort.
 A 5-10 year community plan to refurbish the Trentham racecourse for "BushRaces" needs to be considered:
- visits to the **Trentham** Falls;
- something to do with **Forestry**;
- the hugely successful Trentham's Got Talent, being held on the Friday night at the Mechanics Hall;
- the hugely successful bootscoot held on the Saturday night at the Mechanics Hall; and
- period dress worn by townspeople on say, the Saturday.

It has since occurred to me that the events attached to the successful **Sustainability** day might also be added. It was thought that we would not want all our eggs in the one festival basket. The excellent

seasonal festivals-Spudfest,
Trentham Spring Festival and Words
in Winter would remain unaffected. I
strongly believe that this is one idea
whose time will come: it is just a
case of when. I invite people to email

CHANGE TO BUS TIMES

V/Line has made a change to the Daylesford to Woodend bus that will come into effect starting Sunday 19th July 2009. The adjusted times are as follows:

Monday to Friday bus will now leave Daylesford at 7.35am (10 minutes earlier than previously). Saturday morning bus will now leave Woodend at 10.25am (5 minutes earlier than previously). Sunday morning bus will now leave Woodend at 10.45am (5 minutes earlier than previously).

The times for Trentham and other towns on the route will be similar to the above (10 or 5 minutes earlier). The bus has been adjusted to ensure a connection with the train departing or arriving from/ to Melbourne. The current service times mean that the bus gets in dangerously close to the train departing. The new times will ensure passengers don't miss the train.

AVERAGE DOUBLED IN AUGUST Rain has fallen every day during the month and the record of 1027 points were recorded up till 9 a.m. yesterday, August 30. This compares with 206 points registered for August 1938.

For the same month in 1936, 844 points were recorded. For the past 19 years the average fall for August is 501 points.

For the 8 months of this year 4028 points have been recorded against 2172 for the same period last year.

Trentham Falls present a magnificent sight with the large amount of water pouring over the 100ft. drop. It is many years since such an amount of water was seen there. Spray from the Falls is blown high into the air and adds to the beauty of the scene. TRENTHAM DISTRICT PRIMARY SCHOOL – A NEW BEGINNING

Monday 13th July marked a very important and long awaited day for the students and staff at the Trentham primary school. It was the first day in Trentham's new school. For the past 28 years students and staff have been learning and teaching in "temporary" classrooms after the original school house was deemed unfit as a classroom. (The portables were supposed to stay for 5-6 years). Thanks to the Victorian Government's "Rural Schools Replacement Program", nearly \$1.5 million has been spent on the project. The building is a modern design that incorporates all the facilities that a school will need in the 21st century; 4 large, open and well lit learning areas each with a unique outdoor learning area, a library, an open and very functional central gallery all complemented by a "state of the art" administration area. The classrooms are all fitted for new interactive "smart boards" and computers feature in every room. One of the outstanding features of the new school is the use of technology to help heat and cool the building, with all round insulation, double glazed windows and auto venting during the hotter months. Rainwater is collected and reused through the school and landscaping will take place over the next few weeks. The second half of the year will see further development at the Trentham Primary School with construction of a multi function arts. music and sports building funded by the Federal Government to the tune of \$850,000. What an exciting year it has been for our community and next year 2010 promises some practical and useful projects that will provide services and interaction between the Trentham District Primary School and the Trentham community. COMMUNITY BANK BRANCH FOR TRENTHAM

I have lived here all my life, raised my children here, have been involved with most of the clubs and organisations in Trentham, have run a business for a long period of time and I passionately believe it is the right time for us to establish a Community Bank Branch in our community.

Over the 21 years we were in business, we gave raffle prizes, fuel vouchers, almost anything an organisation asked for to help out the town. Now when I look around, the same clubs and organisations are still just keeping their heads above water. Nothing much has changed . . . well, ves it has: the 2 BIG BANKS left. the butcher closed, the supermarkets amalgamated, the Cosmo burnt down and I suppose Trentham has gone backwards. So, I need your help to change all of this.....and yes, we can change it as long as we have your support.

Community banks are essentially a franchise that the community owns: for a minimum of \$500 (up to \$10,000) you can own a piece of your own bank.

In 2008 the BIG 4 BANKS profit equalled \$680 per household . . . that's a lot of money!! So, if Trentham people support a Community Bank by buying shares and banking with them, then some of this \$680 per household could come back into our community and help with whatever we would like to see happen in Trentham. If we work with the Daylesford & District Community Bank to have our own branch here in Trentham, we could have more banking services and a dividend back into the community. If we all supported a community bank, who knows what we could achieve?

We need to raise capital from Trentham for this to happen. Making a pledge and becoming a shareholder means that you are contributing to establishing a Community Bank Branch for TRENTHAM. Then we need to support the Community Bank . . . and the more we support it, the more money can come back into the community.

I have worked really hard over a long period of time to try to get funding for a lot of things that our community has a right to. My understanding of a Community Bank is that after we pay Bendigo Bank its share for banking services and we pay dividends to our shareholders, we then have money for the community. Inglewood (Google population of 800) distributed over \$70,000 dollars back into their community organisations in the last financial year.

I don't know of another way that we could have this amount of "cash stimulus" for Trentham. And the point is that it is so easy: we all have to pay for banking, so why not make sure some of the money comes back to our community and local shareholders?

Pledge forms are available for pickup and drop-off at the Newsagency. Please give serious thought to helping our community grow and become a vibrant and active town. It is totally up to you for this to become a reality - BRING BACK OUR SENSE OF COMMUNITY -SUPPORT OUR EFFORTS FOR A COMMUNITY BANK BRANCH FOR TRENTHAM.

If you don't you will be kicking yourself.

LANDCARE IN TIMES OF CHANGE

Trentham District Landcare Group is best known for its farm based projects. Revegetation, particularly of riparian, or wetland areas, is supported by grants to landholders, and by involvement with Tree Project. Active eradication and management of weeds using the group's equipment is also a focus of the Group. Bi monthly meetings are a forum for information sharing, with speakers discussing a range of topics, which have recently included

geo-thermal energy, fox management, and local revegetation projects. While these activities remain integral to our Landcare Group, there are a growing number of small landholders and township newcomers, who are interested in Landcare. They are our new membership base.

Like many newcomers to our town they are attracted to the open spaces, access to the Wombat Forest, and a sense of belonging to a community. Their involvement with the natural environment includes bush walking. horse riding, bird watching, plant observation, seed collecting.... growing indigenous plants. They represent the *changing* face of Landcare. In order that our widening membership base is represented on the TDLG committee, it is anticipated that representatives from this demographic will become committee members. The Annual General meeting of TDLG is to be held in August. (Annual General meeting, TDLG, 12 August, 2009.To be held at Pig& Whistle) A project proposed by a group of new members is Weed Free Trentham. The group is concerned about the abundance of gorse and broom on roadsides and public spaces within the township. The proposal to work on weed eradication in town is multi-pronged.

It will involve

- Recognition of weeds (bad guys) and recognition of indigenous plants (good guys)
- Ways to remove small scale weed infestation
- Work in teams around town, you help me at my place, I will help you at your place
- Taking a walk to identify good guys
- Supporting revegetation projects in Reserves around the town
- Protecting quality natural environments

TDLG is embracing change, changes to our demographics, changes to climate and social change.

Landcare is an organization with a sound reputation. Its projects are diverse, but all are concerned with

improving, protecting, rehabilitating and maintaining natural resources.

upstream of the Falls, Trent Creek
upstream of the Bath Street Reserve
and Stony Creek upstream of the
Reserve.It is expected that this work
will be carried out in Spring.
The work within Trentham township
will contribute to the development of
walking trails linking the town to the
Wombat Forest to the south.






