#### **Weather Report**

#### TRENTHAM IN JANUARY

- Rainfall 105.5mm (Av 54.5mm)
- Mean max. 23.0°C (Av 21.9°C)
- Mean min. 11.4°C (Av 9.8°C)

WETTEST JANUARY SINCE 1993 Storms on the 1st gave 49.5mm in 24 hours, the largest daily fall since February 2004. In the evening, 29.8mm fell in 38 minutes, giving flash flooding. Heat and dryness returned with 33.3° on the 16th. Tropical moisture then invaded giving extreme humidity and uncomfortable nights - 19.7° on the 17th. Over five days, 52mm of rainfall with 30mm on the 20th. Much drier, almost autumnal conditions followed, but at last, the grass is green again! Rainfall was twice the average and month mean temperature was 1.4° above average. There were six nights above 15° and 12 days over 25°.

### Sign up for a prize!


TRATA has recently secured funding to help promote Trentham. Part of the funding is to be used to erect a sign at the falls to encourage people to visit the town centre.




