Isn't that a wonderful number?

This is the amount people have pledged to support the establishment of a Community Bank® in Trentham. Many of these pledges have been received in the last couple of weeks since it was decided to launch a campaign for a stand-alone **Trentham & Districts Community Bank**®.

Congratulations and thanks to everyone who has made a pledge to support 'our bank'.

Last month's Newsletter reported the pledge amount was \$400,000+ We are now \$100,000 closer to the **target** of \$650,000 for our Feasibility Study – pretty good going for a month.

So far 178 people have made pledges for that magnificent \$502,500 total (as at 20 May – closing date for this Newsletter) and many others have promised to follow up on the paperwork. We'd love to get lots more people involved so that 'our bank' has the widest possible ownership by our communities – so that it is truly each and everyone's 'our bank'. Pledges have come in from people in Blackwood, East Trentham, Fern Hill, Little Hampton, Lyonville, Newbury, Spring Hill, Trentham and Tylden; from friends and family far and wide; from businesses and traders; from people who want to give their children or grandchildren a continuing link to this community; self-managed superannuation funds; from people increasing their earlier pledge; and so many people who are just excited about what a Community Bank® can do for our communities.

The local Community Bank® group (Corina, Georgie, Ian, Sue and me) are very confident that the **Trentham & Districts Community Bank**® will succeed and, although that will be the name on the shopfront, it is important to recognise the stake the surrounding towns and districts, each with its own identity, will have in 'their bank' . . . 'our bank' . . . 'everyone's bank'.

There's lots to be done between now and when we open the door to 'our bank'. Firstly we need to expand the existing group into a Steering Committee, and to continue gathering pledges and new banking business (note that to open an account with the **Trentham & Districts Community Bank**® or to transfer your banking you should quote our Branch reference number **72102**). When we get to the \$650,000 'trigger point' we will commission an independent Feasibility Study. Everyone who has made a pledge (and others) will be asked to participate in the Feasibility Study which, if positive (as we're sure it will be), will lead to formation of a Board and company structure, developing a business plan and a Prospectus. We hope that we will launch our Prospectus in October and that's when we'll be asking people to convert their pledge into a shareholding in 'our bank'.

In the short term we can speed up the process by gathering pledges and banking business to reach the \$650,000 target – and we'll continue seeking pledges right up to the date the Prospectus is issued to maximise community ownership of 'our bank'. We also need people to understand the concept of, and process for developing, a Community Bank® so please feel free to discuss with us any questions you might have. If you have already made a pledge you should consider yourself 'part of the team' and look for opportunities to spread the message.

The 'launch' of the **Trentham & Districts Community Bank**® campaign at the Farmers Market (15 May) drew lots of interest. Several people remarked about how Trentham was booming or about to take-off. Certainly with Spudfest, property sales, a re-vamped Trentham website, Buy Local launch, the Cosmo Stables open, Chrissy taking over the Hardware store, an extension to the Trentham Hotel, Aussie Home Deliveries opening

in Market St, lots of houses being built and new residents (and I hope I haven't left anything out) it's a very bright and confident start to winter – we almost need a weekly Newsletter to keep up to date!

3 We're very conscious that everyone wants to know when? and where?

We'd love to be able to answer these questions but we can't at this stage.

We've got a process to go through that protects the interests of everyone involved and the only thing we can all do in the short term is get our pledge tally up to the Feasibility Study 'trigger' as soon as possible. So, if we can reach our \$650,000 target asap we can shorten the process. Then, assuming we get the green light from the Feasibility Study, we will form the Board and company structure, develop our business plan and Prospectus. We plan to launch the Prospectus in October and then raise the capital funding necessary to build and staff the Bank. That will be the other stage when you and everyone can accelerate the time scale. If everything goes to plan, and we can save a week or so getting to our pledge target and in raising our capital, we should have construction of 'our bank' well underway before the end of this year.

While we have had discussions with property owners in the commercial centre of Trentham, until we form a Board with legal status we can't negotiate or sign any contracts, so we are unable to advise the likely location for 'our bank'. We'll let you know as soon as we can – and I assure you we're as anxious as you are to get a

sign up saying "we've got our site – here it is'. Won't that be a great day in Trentham?

TRENTHAM SUSTAINABILITY GROUP

Have you ever walked along the beach and turned to see your footprints meandering through the sand? This is one type of footprint we leave. Our *ecological footprint* is the amount of resources consumed and waste produced by every activity we undertake. In Victoria, the average person requires 6.8 hectares of land to sustain their lifestyle. If everyone lived this way we'd need four Earths to support ourselves!

The largest contributor to our ecological footprint is carbon dioxide emissions from fossil fuels, in other words our carbon footprint. Carbon dioxide or CO₂ is one of the main greenhouse gases and Australian households produce an average of 14 tonnes each year, mainly through burning fossil fuels to generate electricity and power vehicles.

By calculating your *carbon footprint* and looking at ways of using energy better you can help to reduce global warming and save money!

The Carbon Rationing Action Group (CRAG) is a volunteer group who can visit you and calculate your carbon emissions using your energy bills, car and aeroplane usage and the amount of waste you generate. They will then suggest where savings can be made and offer tips on reducing energy use.

COUNCILLOR'S CORNER

Well council is well into the budget process for the second time in my stint and once again the process isn't that easy. It is a fine balance between the rising cost of services and actions that the community wishes us to take. Submissions closed last month, but that doesn't mean that you can't approach or contact me to discuss ideas for the budget before we meet to finalise, fine tune and move it as a council motion on June the 22nd. I have been very grateful for the input of various community members and welcome any input and expertise from the community in the lead up to the next budget that may ensure that it is as equitable and fully considered as possible.

Thanks to all who have submitted footpath survey responses so far, I expect to close submissions at the end of June and compile the strategy. I will invite people to come and see the draft before I finalise it. and put it to TRATA as a sub-document to the community plan to feed into the infrastructure budget for council in the next two years. As a document that has had full community input and backing it will have more weight than individual submissions direct to council, though it may take upto a year to get action on the ground.




