TRENTHAM SAYS NO TO FAMILY VIOLENCE

Five local Trentham businesses have joined the 'Say NO to Family Violence' campaign led by Member for Macedon, Mary-Anne Thomas.

Trentham CWA, Trentham & Districts Community Bank® Branch, Trentham Neighbourhood Centre, Trentham Post Office and the St Mary Magdalen's Op Shop have joined other businesses and associations in the Hepburn & Daylesford region in making a banner to display in the lead up to November 25th, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women.

Ms Thomas' recently caught up with the Trentham CWA to see their completed banner, and discuss the work that the Andrews Labor Government is doing to combat Family Violence.

1.9 billion is being invested across Victoria to end family violence. The Government is working with the community, victims, Victoria Police and peak services to implement the 227 recommendations of the Royal Commission into Family Violence.

Ms Thomas said the aim of the 'Say NO to family violence' campaign is to raise awareness about the gendered dimensions of family violence and to send a clear message that it will not be tolerated in our community.

TRENTHAM COMMUNITY WATER FORUM

On 13th September, 10 representatives from Coliban Water presented a Forum for members of the Trentham community at the Mechanics Institute. The forum was attended by a number of concerned residents including Mayor Klein and an officer from Council. Such Forums are being held in various centres within the area of CW's responsibility but the timing may have been prompted by a request from the Trentham FORUM for discussions regarding water security.

The source of Trentham's water supply was outlined. The supply is solely from groundwater collected from a spring and bore a few hundred metres from the top of the range, south-east of the town.


The water supply and demand were set out, together with projections for the future, taking account of projected climate change, resulting reduction in supply and projected increases in demand as a result of population growth. It was evident that at some point, potentially as early as 2018, water supply will not meet demand. Alternatives to meet the increased demand were then outlined, together with costs. It was clear that the most expensive alternative was sewer mining, providing recycled water. The least expensive alternatives were an increase in the groundwater supply using additional bores or a pipeline from Tylden.

The presentation was followed by a panel discussion introduced by Mary-Anne Thomas, Member for Macedon. During this discussion, questions were raised by residents, including the limits and fallibility of relying on further groundwater, the concerns regarding use of potable water on the sports ground and the cost/benefit of recommissioning the two presently unused reservoirs at Fernhill.

The presentation was comprehensive and informative. Further, it appeared that the CW representatives took on board the concerns of the community and will take those concerns into account for future planning.



Halloween 500 years ago was when Martin Luther, then a youngish academic concerned with some church practices, nailed up his '95 Theses' on the church door in his home university town, Wittenberg, Germany.

Do you salary sacrifice into superannuation?

Consider Mavis' case

Mavis is a 56 year old employee of BHP Billiton and has been salary sacrificing to superannuation for the last few years to build her retirement nest egg. Mavis is concerned that due to the changes in superannuation contribution limits that she may need to revise the amount that she salary sacrifices into superannuation.

Mavis currently earns \$253,000 gross earnings per year as an office manager, her superannuation guarantee that is paid by her employer is 9.5% up until the maximum superannuation contribution base which comes to \$20,049.

The new concessional contribution cap for 2018 is \$25,000 which means Mavis has the ability to salary sacrifice up to this amount. As a result Mavis can salary sacrifice an additional \$4,951 to be within the concessional superannuation contribution limit.

Mavis will need to consider Division 293 taxation consequences as her income (including reportable super) exceeds \$250,000. Division 293 tax of 15% applies to concessional contributions when the \$250,000 threshold is exceeded. As Mavis is \$3,000 over the threshold she will pay an extra 15% tax on these superannuation contributions, equating to \$450.

The last Council meeting was gratifying in that after ten months without Council meetings in our neck of the woods our Council elected to resume meetings in Trentham (along with the other towns in the shire) from October 2017.

It is perhaps the return of democracy and a welcome one too.

For us as a community, it is perhaps a reminder of what it is to be without a voice and a reminder also of how important it is not to take this voice for granted.

Sometimes when someone insists on their point of view, or yells the loudest, it's another way of losing our collective voice.

This is something to cherish and value. And something that we should work on together, to join our voices to shape our character and path.

This not only ensures that everyone feels heard, but that we retain the power that is inherent in our collective identity, as a town, as a community.

The information about the limitations of our water supply was concerning, but heartening to know that despite the envisioned water recycling project for the footy ground being unfeasible, they will make sure that we don't run out of water.

Finally congratulations to Trentham Saints. How fantastic that four of our teams won Grand Finals in the football and netball. We can only hope that it is a portent of things to come for our fine town.




