IT'S ALL HAPPENING THIS WEEKEND IN TRENTHAM

Spudfest is a celebration of our wonderful village, of the bounteous food bowl in which we live and of our proud agricultural history. It continues a tradition of boosting community pride and connection, which is clear from the diverse range of people involved in the festival in various ways – as stall holders, sponsors, spudbuddies and supporters.

This year, for the twelfth anniversary, the festival continues around the whole town with four precincts. Each one has a distinct feel – Foodie-Focus and Family Fun of SpudHub; History and Competitions on Town Square, including the inaugural SpudCar Show&Shine – (visit & vote for your favourite - you could win a prize); the Tractor-Pull, Classic Cars and Mixed Market at the Railway Station; the Classic Devonshire Tea Tent and Music & Makers on Market Street;. Catch up on all the fun either by jumping on the Horse & Cart around the village or by walking off your Spudly indulgences!

It's also a day to celebrate our community & support the organisations that support us. A number of groups are running fund-raising activities including the CFA, Trentham Primary School, Bullarto Primary School, Trentham Kindergarten and the Historical Society. Spudfest doesn't charge for community stalls, to help them raise as much money as possible.

We're very grateful to our "Gold Spud" sponsors – Hepburn Shire, Trentham & Districts Community Bank® and Harkin Property. We encourage you to buy from the local community stalls and from local businesses – it's all part of supporting our community.



Since its creation, Spudfest has been brought to life by volunteers. This year, we have expanded our fabulously passionate Working Party who have all put in huge efforts to make improvements in every area – as Big Spud, my personal thanks go to each of them.

SPUD HUT BUS TOUR

This tour visits three of the huts that were provided to the "Spud Diggers" - seasonal workers who came to the district for the potato season, then moved on when the crops had all been lifted. Their farmer employers provided a hut for accommodation, with no running water or electricity. Occasionally, a digger would be allowed to remain in his hut between seasons and sometimes that became a semi-permanent arrangement.

One of these workers, Bob Stewart, lived in his hut on the Dwyer's farm until he was 97 years old. He never complained about the lack of "mod cons" and despite reading by candlelight of an evening, he needed no glasses until he was more than 100 years old.

Tours run for about an hour and depart from the Town Square at 11.00am, 12.30pm and 2.15pm. Tickets are \$10 each; family of 4 for \$30 – all proceeds support the Historical Society. You can also buy Historical Society books and the locally produced "Trentham Tatties" cookbook will be available for sale.

ENTERTAINMENT SCHEDULE:

- Main Stage at SpudHub kicks off with the Walsh Family Band at 10.15, followed by a rich assortment of "feel-good, toe-tapping" music, changing every hour and including local favourites Cat & Clint and the Greater Gliders.
- Kids Stage at SpudHub features choirs & bands from local schools, the fabulous TimTim's beautiful bubbles will float you through the morning and Phil Melgaard returns with his particular brand of fun & magic to bring a smile to your dial in the afternoon.
- Music and Makers on Market includes an Open Air Licensed Cafe, with a laid-back vibe, featuring Local Musos delivering a range of musical styles. While you're listening, grab a bite from Food Trucks or Cafes or have a scrummy Devonshire Tea, featuring locally-grown, locally-baked Potato Scones with traditional Strawberry Jam and Cream or home-made Sweet Potato Jam – yum! Then wander through the Artisan Market, with hand-made creations.
- The Kyneton Walking Band will be doing their strolling muso thing, leaving Quarry Park at 11am, Noon and 1pm take a musical meander up Main Street.
- •Tractor Pull at the Railway Station runs from 10.30 to 3.30. Cool Country Classic Cars will be showing all day.

TRENTHAM SPUD DIGGERS

You can still see many of the old spud huts on the edges of farms, the remnants of a long history of potato growing in these parts. These are small huts of wood or tin or brick (the fancy ones) with a fireplace and not much else. The huts were used to house spud diggers, itinerant workers who came back year after year. The harvest began in April after the first frosts of autumn and went through the winter. A digger lifted 10 bags a day, 1,500 lbs in total. In the early 20th century the farmer made 10 shillings a bag and from that the digger got 2 shillings. Sam Gamble held the record for a single day's digging – 47 bags!

Some of the diggers were returned servicemen, most were just men down on their luck. Many kept warm through the bitter winters by patronising local pubs. There are countless stories of frostbite or even death when men fell asleep by the side of the road on the way home. Brian Wright was known as the Oxford Scholar. He was educated at Oxford and served in the Second World War, but took to the drink. Bob Stewart, born in Scotland, served in World War I and lived to 100 years in a small hut stacked full of books. Bruce McKenzie wrote of him:

**And although in things
material there is nothing much
to show, Bob's attitude to life
makes him the richest
man I know.**

The huts are now mostly derelict but have been documented by Trentham Historical Society in "A Hard Day's Work" available for \$7 from the Old Police Station in Camp Street.

WOMEN'S WELLNESS CLINIC

Springs Medical is proud to support our local community by offering specialised clinics at both our Trentham and Daylesford campuses.

At our Springs Medical Trentham site, Dr Zabidi runs regular cervical screening (CST) clinics (Pap test clinics) and also provides expert women's wellness checks to support your health concerns.

The Cervical Screening Test replaced the Pap test in 2017. The Cervical Screening Test detects infection with human papillomavirus (known as HPV).

It is recommended that women attend for HPV testing every five years from 25 years of age or two years since their last Pap test, with exit testing from 70- 74 years of age, even if you are no longer sexually active.

THE Z-NET COMMUNITY TRANSITION PLAN

Trentham Sustainability Group (TSG) has been an active participant in the development of the Hepburn Shire Community Transition Plan. The Plan, launched in early April 2019, aims to make Hepburn a 'zero-net emissions community' within 10 years.

The project commenced in 2017 when local sustainability groups and community members put forward a submission to Hepburn Shire Council to implement an ambitious Zero-Net Energy Target for the shire. In 2018, with assistance from Sustainability Victoria's Take2 Community Transition Pilot, Hepburn Shire was selected to conduct Victoria's first Zero-Net Emission Transition (Z-NET) Pilot.

The pilot was designed to:

- provide a blueprint for how rural communities can satisfy their energy needs with renewables, and
- create a masterplan (Community Transition Plan) providing approaches to reach zero-net emissions in all sectors.

The Community Transition Plan is an invaluable resource for communities wishing to cut local emissions. The Plan documents the shire's current emissions profile (by sector and geographically) and provides comprehensive approaches to cut emissions in energy, transport, agriculture, land use and waste.

With its strong community foundation, this Plan is a grassroots response to the global challenge of climate change.

Developed with the local community and various research, industry and technical stakeholders, the blueprint is the most in-depth, place-based carbon emissions reduction strategy in Australia.

We hope you will get involved in this exciting project. For the generations who come after us we must do all we can to reduce the catastrophic impacts of climate change.



Trentham's Kath Morrison said her first reaction to being honoured for nearly 65 years' service as a community volunteer was to feel embarrassed.

This was because she loves what she does and believes it gives her back more than she puts in.

The Hepburn Shire honoured her by adding her name to its Heather Mutimer Honour Roll of distinguished women of the region to mark International Women's Day last month.

The council created the honour roll in 2005 to recognise women who have made outstanding contributions to the community.

Kath's service as a Trentham volunteer started when she was 15, when she was asked to help out with the Girl Guides, where she later became a district leader.

She has since been involved delivering meals, volunteering with aged care, with Trentham's Historical Society and Neighbourhood Centre, as President of the St Mary Magdalen Guild and Op Shop, where she still works, and at the Tylden Cemetery Trust, where she is current president.

Her remarkable unbroken 65 years' service has been in addition to bringing up four children - and she today helps out as a volunteer at her grandsons' school in Flemington.

"I had always wanted to be a nurse and I did the Aged Care qualification after my children grew up and left home." she said.

TRENTHAM EASTER ART & CRAFT SHOW

The 17th Trentham Art & Craft Easter Show started with a bang, with a packed opening night crowd and sales and judges praising the high standard of entries.

There were a record 355 entries by 152 exhibitors.

The 29 sales on the Thursday opening night set a trend for the rest of the show, with a flurry of red dots indicating the pieces sold.

Major prize winners of the \$5700 prize pool were:

Glenlyon sculptor <u>Lord Bloomfield</u>, Best in Show Craft (\$1000) and a new prize, the Matthew Harding Prize for Technical Excellence (\$500) for his striking, armour-plated stag's head, "Dainn" (The Dead One).

<u>Susan McBratney</u>, Best in Show Art (\$1000) for "Poppies", and Jennifer Barnett, Gweneth Wisewould Portrait Prize (\$500) for "John Cooper".

Opening the show, local journalist/artist Peter Young praised the high standard of work exhibited, including in the junior art section.

"Trentham has a reputation for being one of Australia's regional art capitals. The standard of entries in the junior section of this show shows that maintaining that status into the future is in good hands," he said.

He also said artists were as important to a community's health as any other vocation, given arts' proven role improving cognitive development of youngsters, the health of the elderly and, most important, in nurturing the soul of a population.

He noted that prominent gallery proprietor and art dealer Stuart Purves, who operates a sculpture park at nearby Porcupine Ridge, often said: "You can't eat art but it sure as hell feeds you".

Young urged the public to buy Trentham art, which helps artists and the community, via the art show's heavy financial investment in the local region, but which also helps the new owner of original art by enriching their lives.

This year's show paid tribute to absent friends via its committee's purchase of a lovely portrait of the late David Bryant by Al Dickerson to present to David's wife Janine; and through the introduction of a new technical excellence award honouring the late artist, Matt Harding.

Art show committee members Jill McCallum and Bette McLaren were also honoured after achieving 11 years' service volunteering their time to local arts and crafts.

Young noted in opening the show that the annual exhibition would not be possible without an army of volunteers who help hang the show, dress the venue, manage sales and admissions, and serve drinks and food on the opening night.

LICIA KOKOCINSKI ELECTED

The Victorian Electoral Commission and Returning Officer Jeff Stewart declared Licia Kokocinski elected as Coliban Ward councillor.

Mayor, Cr Don Henderson, said he was looking forward to working with councillor-elect Licia Kokocinski over the remaining two years of this council term.

"This is an important opportunity for Licia to support and advocate for the Coliban community, as this is an important part of our region," Cr Henderson said.

PROPOSED BUDGET OPEN

Council adopted the Proposed Budget 2019/20 for public exhibition at its recent meeting in Trentham.

Mayor Cr Don Henderson said the 2019/20 proposed Budget responsibly funds the operations, services and capital investment to be delivered to the community.

"It delivers ... a number of important infrastructure projects, increased maintenance, and the continuation of essential services – all delivered in a financially sustainable model and with no new borrowings," Cr Henderson said.

The Capital Works program for 2019/20 will be \$9.84 million. This is an investment of 55% of general rates, with projects to be delivered, including more than \$5.5 million in road works.

"Council looks forward to working with the community to deliver a range of projects ... including Trentham Recreation Reserve, new and upgraded footpaths," Cr Henderson said.

"Rate increases have been capped at 2.5% in line with the Victorian Government's Fair Go Rates System." Waste charges have been held at an average 3.2%."

Council will now accept e-waste materials for free to encourage the recycling of e-waste items at transfer stations and has introduced significantly reduced first year animal registration fees to encourage the registration, de-sexing and microchipping of cats and dogs.
