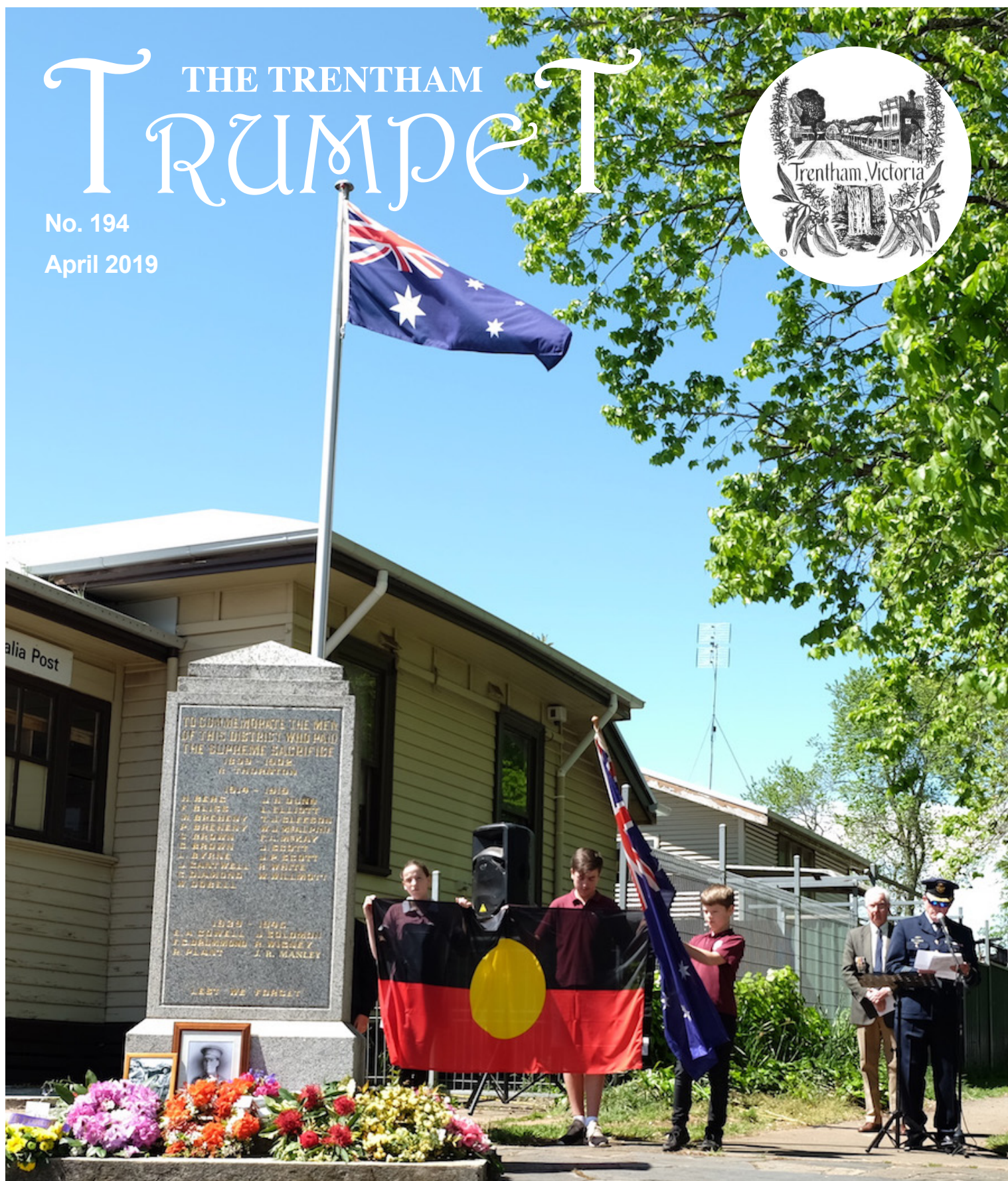

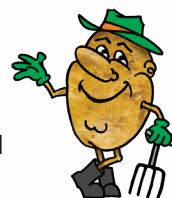
SPOT THE SPUD

QUARRY STREET RESERVE

Update from the Quarry Street Reserve Committee of Management

The Committee is very aware of the increasing numbers of locals and visitors of all ages who use our lovely Reserve. We're actively working with Council to make improvements. In March, Council renewed the mulch in the popular playground and renovated the creek crossing on Victoria Street. The Committee has worked to ensure that paths around the lake are maintained. We recently completed an assessment of park furniture, much of which needs immediate attention, and are consulting with Council regarding upgrades and extension of the facilities. Council have yet to start detailed planning for the project to upgrade of the pavilion and toilets.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS – DAVID BRYANT MEMORIAL WORKING BEE

The late David Bryant had begun a project to rid the island of gorse and blackberries. As a practical memorial tribute to David, we are holding two Working Bees - Friday April 5th & Saturday April 6th. Everybody is very welcome - there are a variety of tasks, so if you are able to help for an hour or more on either day (or both!) we would love you to join in. Council has agreed to provide a large commercial bin, which we aim to fill with gorse and blackberry. Non-island-based tasks may include blackberry removal from the side of the lake (David had poisoned a number prior to his passing); helping transfer material from the boat to the bin; and keeping other volunteers' coffee levels up. When you arrive on site, you must register to be covered by insurance. Please contact David McCallum 0407 848 033 or Helen Macdonald 0419 930 864 to confirm your availability.

The committee is also looking to widen our representation in the community by adding some new members, especially adults with young families. Please ring David or Helen if you are interested.

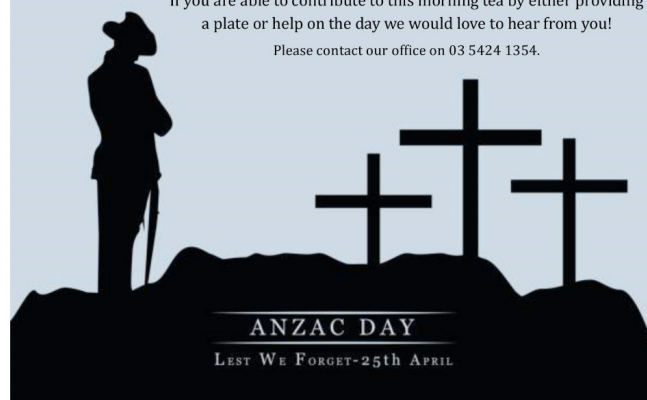

A LETTER FROM THE PAST - Private Reg Clowes

The Historical Society has been working on the letters of Private Reg Clowes from his time with the Australian Imperial Forces in World War I. Reg's father Joseph Clowes ran the General Store in Fern Hill, and Reg wrote regularly to his parents and close sister Hilda who married historian George Trehwella. Towards the end of the war, there were many casualties, including Reg's cousin Steele Maxwell from Tylden.

Following is an extract of one of Private Clowes' letters home.

France
Aug 20th-18

My Dear Hilda,
Right in amongst the battlefields now.
One "town" that we are working in now,
has been the scene of terrific fighting.
It is now a mass of ruins, you couldn't
find one wall intact.
I spose you've heard about poor old Steele
and Geo McAnulty. They say he was
doing splendid work and not seeing
danger went forward a little and was hit
in the right shoulder.
His wounds didn't appear to be very
serious, but he must have suffered
shock very severely. They gave him first
dressing and sent him back and were all
very surprised to hear that he died about
10 hours after.
This morning I was passing a rapidly
growing British cemetery. I asked one of
the grave diggers about him... and (he)
showed me the grave. I can tell you I was

shocked to hear the bad
news, and as I stood and looked
at his little wooden cross, I couldn't help
feeling for his dear people so far away.
The cross bears the simple inscription
"7047 Pte T.S. Maxwell 5th Batt.A.I.F.
11.8.1918".

It is only one amongst hundreds, very
many of which are our own Aussie
boys. I think poor old George McAnulty
is buried further forward. They say he
was in same rush but was sent west
immediately by a bullet through the
heart. It's very cruel and I don't like
writing about it; but I know how anxious
the poor relatives are. If I can find any
further particulars I will.

Trusting you are all tip top as I'm glad
to say I am. Tons of love and kisses
to all.

A Dutch soprano once remarked: "people use their voice wrongly!". The Dutch word for voice is 'stem', which also means vote. A commentator jumped on the double meaning: people use their vote wrongly!

The common Latin origin of vote and voice rings through in other ways: the vote gives people a voice, have a say, be heard. And via the French: one may 'vouch' for someone.

The word 'stem', old English 'stemn', opens up another range of meanings, often equivalent with 'tune': 'stemvork' = 'tuningfork', 'ontstemd' = 'out of tune', 'stemmig' is 'atmospheric' i.e. in harmony, in tune.

The musical metaphor was often used by Karl Haas, who presented for years an informative program on ABC Classic FM, where he used to point out that the development of ensemble music since Mozart was a training in democracy: none of three or four etc. instruments has a leading role, all voices are equal and have to work it out together. When ensembles improvise, there is not even a score, only a heightened sense for the harmonies, rhythms and melodic elements involved. An inherent lawfulness allows for myriad variations.

As soon as the voting is over, the voice becomes the real thing and with the voice: the listening, a silence in which speakers can actually hear each other, and then respond in tune with the lawfulness inherent in the dignity, peace, justice the political process is about. Such process doesn't exclude disagreements, just as playing music doesn't avoid dissonant chords. They are often vital ingredients, the spice of life, a challenge to the goodwill from all sides to transcend and to resolve.

I write this as a tribute to our councillor Sebastian Klein, who has been the voice of goodwill for 10 years and as a welcome to whoever will have been elected to tune in.

The road less travelled. That is what we endured, with miles of hot dusty tracks, roads with potholes and jagged rocks, highways of oppressive heat radiating melting tar and exhaust fumes into the nostrils.

On the last day, we stopped off at the slums that surround the school and training centre. This was an eye-opener! Many of the children from the slums attended the school and an old woman raised her hands up to the gods to show gratitude for what we had given. Riding into the school, children and families lined the street and cheered as we made our way to the finish line. It was hard to hold back the emotions after eight long days on bikes, some days 43km, others 110km. The children gathered clapping and singing and presented us with gifts.

The camaraderie and support from the other riders and the professional Grasshopper team was unconditional. The friendships forged will last many years to come; a bond through challenges, laughter and tears.

The team of 23 riders raised over \$183,000 Aussie dollars. Steve and I raised a massive \$19,000, made possible because of this wonderful community we live in. Thank you to all who not only donated directly to the ride but all the ticket bearers, the ticket buyers, little gifts donated for the ride and all the local artists who donated work for the mini-raffle. Thanks to all the people who attended Jacinta Carboon's long lunch and the Williamson Charity Oaks Day, to support four other people from Trentham who rode.

Every cent raised will go to the training centre and I can assure you this will go a long way. Last year there were 14 riders for the inaugural ride. This year it doubled and who knows how many next year. I recommend this life-changing experience to anyone looking for a challenge and to help people in need at the same time. No real experience necessary and something you can tell your grandkids.

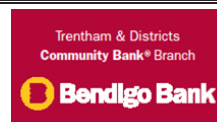

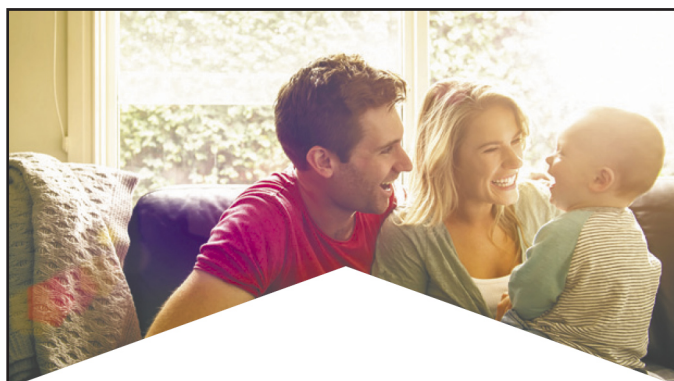

TRENTHAM GROUNDWATER

We have progressed with our project to secure Trentham's drinking water supply.

In December 2018, we applied to amend our existing groundwater licence to include two new bores and increase the licence volume by 220 megalitres per year.

If approved by Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW), the licensed volume would increase from 48 to 268 megalitres per year.

In late February and early March this year we undertook pumping tests on a new deeper bore at the water treatment plant site.

The pumping test was carried out to confirm the bore yield and water quality, and to satisfy requirements to progress the licence application.

We would like to extend our thanks to all landholders who provided input and valuable local knowledge and assisted with the pumping tests by including their bores in the monitoring program.

Our contractor GHD will now prepare a report with the outcomes from the test for GMW.

We will provide further community updates once we know the outcome of our groundwater licence application, which is not expected until May 2019.

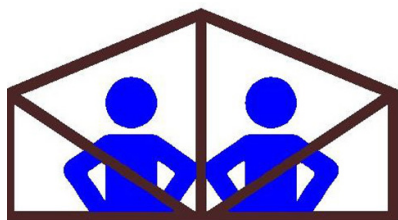

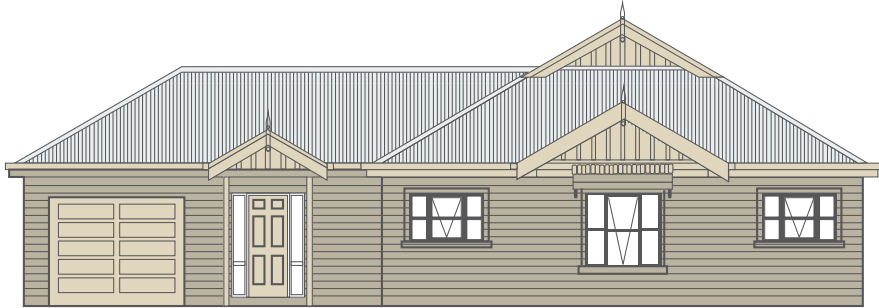
