'Blow, blow, thou Winter wind!'



Many people will be aware of Ellie Kemp's health problems. Ellie, our pharmacist, makes a huge contribution to our town. So many people are inspired and encouraged by her confidence in and vision for, our town. The Pharmacy is one of the 'highlights of High St' and her purchase of the Newsagency has been warmly welcomed by the community. Ellie is a strong supporter of the Community Bank proposal and the Business Support Project. Many thanks Ellie for all you have done for Trentham so far and we wish you all the best for your treatment - we're thinking of you.

Hepburn Shire's Draft Budget 2009/10 offers Trentham very little for the rates we pay. Although Trentham has 6.5 % of the Shire's total population (or 10.2% of the 5 towns' population), the draft budget proposes **less than 1%** of the money for the projects highlighted in the Mayor's introduction (totalling \$4 million) will be spent in Trentham. (Note that almost all of this spending is in the towns so the comparison should be with the 10.2% figure.) Much of the problem relates to Council deciding to only spend money on facilities it owns or controls – and it owns very little in Trentham compared to Creswick, Clunes and Daylesford.

TRATA sought \$20,000 for painting the Station and, although there is an amount of \$321,000 for maintenance of four Visitor Information Centres across the Shire, has not, at the time of writing, been successful. Council does pay two insurance premiums for the Station but, again, this is **less than 1**% of the VIC budget item. Mulcahy's Rd residents also submitted a strong submission and petition for sealing (or at least a major up-grading of) their road which is a dust-strip in summer and a quagmire in winter. Again at the time of writing Mulcahy's Rd has not been included in the Budget. We are satisfied that our Ward Councillor, Cr Sebastian Klein, has represented these needs strenuously within the Council's processes, however little seems to have changed with the new Council and CEO. He did have a small but significant 'win' at Council's July meeting when a vote to 'un-tie' the Federal infrastructure funding from the Market St toilets was agreed. The motion allowed for the money to be used as the community wants and Sebastian has already called a meeting of interested people to suggest the appropriate re-allocation.

Even if the two Trentham projects (above) are included in the final budget, the longstanding issue of Trentham getting 'a fair go' from Council remains. In its submission to the Draft Budget TRATA has also called for Council to implement a rolling average pro-rata allocation of expenditure to ensure that all ratepayers get fair treatment. ## TRENTHAM NEIGHBOURHOOD CENTRE

This is the first of what I hope will be a regular monthly update on what is happening at TNC both in our program of workshops and events and in the long awaited extension to the centre.

At the end of April the Federal Government anounced funding for the extension of TNC. So after a very long wait and a great deal of work over many years by Pam, Katy, LeeAnne and our Committee of Management we are about to get the extra meeting rooms, accessable toilets and community meeting space that the centre desparately needs. As you read this, our architect will be working on the technical drawings for the extension. We hope to put contracts out to tender in August and have the build started by October. We are aiming to have the extension open in March 2010. According to

cost estimates we are still \$47,000 short. We will have a better idea of the real cost of the extension when we receive the builder's quote but meanwhile TNC and the Trentham Community Group are still trying to raise funds. If you or an organisation you represent could make a donation to our building fund it would be gratefully received.

You should all have a copy of the Winter term brochure now. I hope you find things of interest in it. If there is something you would like to see in the program or if you have some knowledge, skill or passion you would like to share with your community, please let Katy or myself know. Some ideas I have been given recently are: a music & movement group for toddlers; an informal craft circle: one-to-one tax advice; basic car maintenance; how to support your child's literacy. This is your centre so please keep the ideas coming.

### 2010 ART & CRAFT SHOW

As previously reported this year's Show was a great success and we need to start work now to prepare for next year.

The Mechanics Institute has been booked; we have an amazingly detailed file of all the contacts, draft letters, certificates, 'to do' lists, timelines etc necessary to run the event; a substantial carry-forward 'float'; and the list of the helpers who come out each year for the actual event – all we need is an enthusiastic committee of 6-7 to take responsibility for managing this great contribution to Trentham's calendar of events.

The key organisers of previous Shows are not available for the 2010 Show however, in addition to leaving such a detailed brief, they are encouraging a new committee to suggest fresh ideas (eg new categories of awards) for how the 2010 Show can be even more successful.

If you are at all interested in being on the Art Show Committee let any member of TRATA know – we will then organise an initial meeting to go through the existing model and form the committee.

As with all voluntary activities getting involved in something worthwhile can be a lot of fun and satisfaction – the Art Show is a great opportunity to meet interesting people and make a real contribution to your community.

### Weather Report Dr. J. Hollis TRENTHAM IN MAY

Rainfall 44.7mm Av 108.2 Mean max temp. 11.5°C Av 11.0 MOSTLY SETTLED, RATHER DRY.

Temperature showed little variation although it was rather mild 18<sup>th</sup> - 25<sup>th</sup>. Significant rain on 25<sup>th</sup> (23.9mm) gave more than half of the month's total which was only 41% of average. There were no significant events. The five month total of 166.8mm was 46% of average. The driest over this period was 135.3mm in 1967, 141.2 in 1976, 160.4 in 1991 and 161.2 in 1945. Since 1873, only 8 years recorded Jan-May rainfall under 200mm



### **DEVELOPING TRENTHAM**

-Need for more activity-**Progress Association re-formed** 

At a meeting of upwards of 50 residents held at the Mechanics Hall on Thursday last, it was resolved to reorganize the Trentham Progress Association.

The need of a live body to further the interests of the town and district has been felt for some time, and on the instigation of the Rev.Dr. Kissane, after consultation with the members of the existing association, a circular letter was sent to the citizens of Trentham. After various speakers had addressed the gathering on the urgent needs of the town, it was resolved that the Progress Association be re-formed. The following officers were elected: President,Rev.Dr. Kissane;

vice-presidents, Messrs J.T. Trewella, W. Donnan, and N.W.Matthewson; secretary Mr.L.Gleeson; treasurer, Mr.S. Beach.

On taking the chair, the President spoke at length on the duties of citizenship and the necessity of placing matters relating to the betterment of the town first. Private matters were a secondary consideration. The need for advertising the town and district was urgent, as people in the city and other places did not even know where Trentham was situated. He would like to see representatives of the several bodies in the town represented on the committee which is to be appointed. A list of matters needing attention was to be drawn up, and efforts for successfully carrying out the requests made. The bad condition of roads, streets and drains, wandering stock, the Park, and water supply were freely discussed.

Councillor Drummond addressed the meeting on several matters, and in answer to questions relative to the activities of the Country Roads Board, gave valuable information. The chairman thanked Councillor Drummond for his attendance and for the information he had furnished. The next meeting will be held on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March, at the Mechanics', when it is hoped an even larger number of citizens will attend.

## TRENTHAM BUSINESS SUPPORT PROJECT LAUNCHED

The Trentham and district business community was introduced to the Business Support Project at a presentation held at the Trentham Bowling Club in mid-May advised David Wilson, Project Co-ordinator. The Project launch had been publicised by personal invitation to businesses and a direct mail campaign using a brochure insert with Trentham's Community Newsletter with a circulation of 700. The Launch program included an address by Carol Hulst, President of the Hepburn Regional Tourism Association and business operator in the Daylesford district who reported on her recent visit to Europe with a Tourism Victoria promotional team. Carol Hulst spoke of the significant tourism potential for the Daylesford and Macedon Ranges region with Trentham strategically placed to provide opportunities for local businesses.

The Launch has resulted in an enthusiastic response from a broad range of business operators who have registered to participate in a survey to be conducted during June, according to David Wilson. The

Project is designed to stimulate local economic and business development by using a community- based approach to identify needs and problems and then address those concerns to improve the local business climate.

Volunteer Interviewers in twomember teams have signed on to visit businesses, during which they will use a structured questionnaire to gather information to be incorporated into the broader survey and subsequently to be used in a report to be presented to the business community. Interviewers attended one of two briefing sessions held in Trentham recently to familiarise them with the Project and to prepare them for their important role. Programs similar to Trentham's Business Support Project have been very successfully conducted in other towns and cities throughout Australia and those participating in this Project are looking forward to many positive outcomes for local businesses and the community in general, David Wilson said.




