A thought for challenging times...

We and the rest of the world are embroiled in a period of significant change, in the economy, politically, climate change, peak oil, even our local council and the next few years will probably present more challenges for our society than those of our whole previous lifetime. Some years ago I heard a lecture on the impacts of globalization on society. The concluding message was that, when faced by overwhelming challenge, the only sensible course of action for the individual is to 'build community'.

Globalisation was a vague and threatening thing that most of us didn't understand very well. Now we are faced with climate change with its extreme weather events and sea level changes; environmental stresses including species extinction; rising fuel and energy costs; the global financial crisis; population pressures and, in Australia, aging and water shortages. (re water shortages, recent media coverage suggests that Melbourne's water needs may not be met by the huge investments in pipelines and desalination, so what then?)

The logic of 'building community' as a response to these challenges is compelling. Ian MacBean and Ian Williams (Editor).

TRENTHAM IN SEPTEMBER

Rainfall 33.9mm Av 114.2 Mean max temp. 12.1°C Av 11.1 DRIEST FOR 94 YEARS; FROSTY

Although westerly systems were active, moisture infeed from the tropics was lacking. Rain was well distributed but without any 'soaking' events. Warm spells 12-14th, 19th and 25-27th contributed to a 1° above average mean max. Heavy hail and sleet showers with strong winds occurred on 15th. Frost formed on 13 mornings; the coldest was -2.9° on 17th. The mean min. temp. ws 0.5° below average. The only drier Septembers were in 1914, 1899 and 1888.

Cancer of the testis is the most common cancer found in men aged 15 to 35. In most cases, testicular cancer involves a change that can be easily recognised. Congratulations Trentham – we've done well!!

Almost 140 Community Plan surveys have been completed by individuals and households giving the views of more than 210 people across Trentham and district. The responses, comments and ideas in the surveys are a great basis for our community planning process and, more importantly, they are a measure of how much people care for our community and want to have a say in its future.

There are some very clear messages in the responses. We are in great agreement about the things we like about Trentham: friendly people, the sense of community, village atmosphere, our environment and proximity to surrounding towns. Ballarat. Bendigo and 'the big smoke'.

Our concerns include a few major issues and needs: public transport, the Cosmo. too much development, a variety of issues around the viability of the business sector and the main street. There are a lot of other specific issues raised and numerous thoughtful ideas and suggestions of what needs to be done.

The overwhelming message is that Trentham is a positive community with capacity and strength ready to tackle the future . . . as one respondent put it: *there* are lots of talented, creative and hardworking people community – I love it!

What happens next?

1. The survey results are being analysed to identify preliminary priorities and the 'gold nugget' ideas that might have only been mentioned by 1-2 people. We have currently a 20-page

compilation of responses which we'll try to condense down to a more manageable size. results will be reported in the next couple of Newsletters, sent to people who asked for feedback and made available at the survey collection points. (Note that all responses will be held as a valuable reference for the future implementation of the Plan.)

- 2. Meanwhile, the Community Planning Group will interview/survey the ~ 40 clubs and organisations around town. These are the all-important building bricks of our community and their participation in the planning process will ensure we build on their good work and that their contributions are celebrated in the final Plan.
- 3. Early in 2009 there will be a community workshop to set the directions and priorities for the Plan, which will identify the what? who? and when? for our priorities. We want as much involvement by members of the community as possible in the workshop to ensure that the ultimate Plan does represent the wishes of the community.
- 4. The Plan will then be written, verified and launched – "our plan - our future". As well as being our blueprint for the future, the Plan (plus the 140 survey forms and people participating in the workshop) will be the basis from which we will negotiate with government and other parties regarding the future of our town.

One theme that was raised by a number of people was the need for the community to work together; to have a strong, cohesive voice to represent our hopes and needs: and encourage volunteers (and engage newcomers) to ensure that we can sustain the assets and community strengths we value. Elsewhere in this Newsletter there is a call for nominations for the TRATA

committee - we know that not everyone wants to serve on a committee, but there are lots of other ways you can get involved in your community. Don't wait until we've launched the Plan get involved in 2-3 (or more) community activities, which is where you'll meet other positive people and help to build the strength of our community. These are the underlying strengths for what most of us said that we liked about Trentham.

On behalf of our small and enthusiastic Community Planning Group, thank you to everyone who completed the surveys. Ian MacBean

Trentham Talking ...

Time for a U-Turn?

A financial crisis and an economical one can be taken as a call to stop and look and think twice before going further...Trentham has made a down-turn before: throughout the late seventies and the eighties the one closure after the other. About ten years ago we seemed to go uphill again, with TRATA, five places to eat, the bakery and bookshop in the main-street and the renovated railway-station and the DominoTrail and a great local Newsletter.

This trend didn't last and with current petrol prices there is perhaps no point in trying more of the same.

When we discussed Trentham's preferred future, in a set of meetings facilitated by Council, we clearly expressed the wish to not grow too fast, to keep the character of a rural country town and the particular mix of build-up areas with open spaces, the natural and agricultural environment, the peace and friendliness of its social life etc...There was one suggestion, that we should perhaps orientate ourselves more to the North than to the South.

This suggestion was meant literally: look at Castlemaine and Bendigo rather than Melbourne and Ballarat for connections, in business and in cultural affairs...

I think it is time to look at this suggestion again: after all we are at the northern slope of the divide and we are the headlands of the Murrey-Darling catchment area. And with water and carbon as our most urgent concerns, we could be an a position to make a significant difference on both points, by putting all our attention and efforts in getting the land-management and agriculture around us to find the highest water retaining and carbon absorbing methods for our farms, forests and gardens. Topsoil is the most overlooked and neglected infrastructure in our country. Only our farmers can regenerate and increase living topsoil. Conventional farming with its expensive chemicals keeps degrading the soil, transition to organic or biodynamic farming is expensive, too, and very labour-intensive.

But in a time, that governments are keen to create jobs, they better spend it on soil- enhancing projects than on pipelines and agribusinesses that do nothing to improve the water and carbon situation. And there is a lesson here: before the industrialisation of the logging, Trentham had 6 sawmills employing around 100 people. They are all closed and all those jobs got lost.

Industrialising of agriculture will have the same effect: it kills the local family farms and drains the local economies from the flow-on of their farming activities.

The shift from the South to the North could be a metaphor for a shift from fixation with industrial projects toward projects that are in tune with our forestry and farming past, now in a new 'key': chemical- and GM Free, with topsoil-(re)generating methods and healthy products, to contribute to solving our water, carbon and health-problems. Community Bank® Progressing

The Daylesford & District Community Bank® Steering Committee is meeting at least weekly and last week also visited the Bendigo Bank HQ and the community bank in Maldon. We spoke with a director and chairperson of the local board there and it was both exciting and inspirational. They have participated in funding a wide range of projects from floodlighting for the local sportsground, PV panels at the sportsground that offsets the electricity used by the floodlights, piping waste water from a nearby goldmine via the golfclub to 26 local farmers, increasing the size and facilities of the local pre-school and they offer to send every new driver from the district to a 5 day Driver Training Academy in Ballarat so that their skills can be improved – many participants have called it a life saving experience. They found that when their Community Bank® was able to make significant funding available for projects it was much easier to obtain grants from the local council and the State and Federal Governments. They said that another huge benefit but less obvious was the change in attitude of the local communities (they subsequently set up in Newstead and Dunolly) from one of despair in not being able to raise funds or receive grants for projects the communities wanted, to a new "can-do" attitude. All this is at no cost to the community, the Community Bank® has similar fees and charges to the other banks but puts back a significant social dividend into the community. Our local awareness campaign will be starting shortly and we will be seeking pledges of support for raising the necessary funds in the form of share capital to form a local company. Local people can purchase shares in the company that will operate the local branch/es.




